





## Brief History:

His stated purpose was to promote the study of Negro Life and History. As a result, in 1927, under Grand Basileus Harold H. Thomas, Achievement Week became an annual Observance used to recognize individuals who have made significant contributions toward improving the quality of life of African American, both locally and nationally.



The brothers of PI MU NU chapter through the Scholarship committee and chaired by Bro. Paris Raines conducted its annual scholarship event of 2021. In January, applications were submitted to the counselors in all the high schools within the communities they serve. Counselors made the application available to all students beginning February 2021 with a completion date in April. All scholarship applications were based on 1) Overall GPA, 2) Class Rank, 3) School/Civic Involvement, 4) Community Involvement, 5) Character references and 6) a written Essay. This year's essay question was: What would it mean for you to attend college and how would it allow you to positively impact your family and communities (church, work, neighborhood, etc.). The student had to include in the essay someone who supported in their journey toward their educational goals. All applications were evaluated and the chapter awarded \$2,000 in scholarships. This year's winners were:

The competition was close, but these 3 students separated themselves through their superior academic performance. All students were in top 10% of class with average GPA of 3.6.



When we wear the gloves


